Dissertation: “Rural Destinations, Community, and Social Exclusion”

My research examines rural communities across the United States that serve as destinations for in-migrants, seasonal residents, and weekenders and analyzes how being a destination is related to socio-economic inequality and social exclusion. The first paper examines the spatial distribution of rural destinations with respect to natural, socially produced, and urban amenities. The second paper quantitatively analyzes relationships between destination development and socio-economic inequality. The third paper (based on a community-based participatory research project in a case community) qualitatively examines processes through which lower income younger adults are socially excluded.
